Kaz Canada, Inc., Recalls Stinger BK Series Insect Zappers Due to Shock Hazard

Recall Summary - Canada

Name of Product: Stinger Insect Zapper, Stinger 3-in-1 Insect Zapper, BK310CV1 and BK311C(V2)

Hazard: The insect kill grid can detach, posing a shock hazard.

Remedy: Refund

Consumers should immediately stop using the recalled Stinger Bug Zappers, unplug them, and contact Kaz to return the product for a full refund.

Recall Details

Units: about 15,840 in Canada

Description: This recall involves Stinger Insect Zapper electric insect/mosquito traps which are black or gray in color and stand or hang vertically. The units are about 19 inches in height and 6 inches in width and requires an extension cord to operate outside. The recalled models have Type codes ending in YTG and Made in China printed on the silver label on the bottom of the product.
